Life groups are the main place that we do life and faith together, building our relationships with God and with one another.

There are a wide range of groups that meet to explore what it means to follow Jesus and to build family through exploring the Bible, worship, sharing meals or gathering around shared interests.

These groups are also the primary way that we care and pray for one another at NPBC, recognising that there are times for all of us when we need the love and support of those around us.

The groups run at various times and locations through the week in and around Newport Pagnell and Milton Keynes, with the hope that everyone can find a group that suits them. As each one grows, our prayer is always that new groups will begin.

From time to time, we also start new groups specifically for those who might be beginning o even returning to their faith journey.

We love Sundays.

It's a chance to worship and be filled (and refilled) as God's people all together.

We have two services on a Sunday, filled with worship, prayer, teaching and time to be together. Then, on the first Sunday of each month, we meet as One Big Family – a service that the whole family can enjoy together.

Sundays are important to us because they're also a great time to catch up with the wider church family. That's why we have a 30-minute gap between the two services every week, where you can grab a cuppa and catch up with friends. Church Online has become a key component of our weekly worship, enabling those who can't be in the building otherwise to worship and stay in touch with church life. Available from 10.30am every Sunday.

Children are a huge part of our family here at NPBC. Every Sunday, there are age-appropriate activities centred around fun, friendship and Bible teaching for children and young people up to Year 9. At least once a month, we **share in communion together** using the bread and wine to help us remember Jesus' death and the opportunity for life it has given us.

Being a Baptist Church

NPBC exists to see God's kingdom come on earth. More than anything else, that's what we're about. Being church is simply a local expression of God's people organising themselves for worship, family and taking the Good News of Jesus out to the world.

However, also being part of a bigger family is definitely important to us. We've chosen to be a Baptist church which involves a few specific ways of operating and a constitution. It also links us to a heritage of 400 years and to a wider family of Baptists within the UK and an estimated 110 million around the world.

For Baptists, the concept of family is important. We gather together to discern what God is saying to us, and we believe everybody is equal, because everybody has a part to play in the service of God. However, that doesn't mean we all have the same role.

We appoint a leadership team, called Elders, including the Ministers who oversee our vision, values and mission. We also have charity Trustees to ensure good governance, as well as a paid office team who look after the building and church administration.

Building a place where community <mark>can thrive</mark>

We are blessed to own our building which is used for Sunday worship, all our church activities and as a space utilised by the wider community. In recent years, we have felt God calling us to redevelop the building so that we can serve even greater numbers of our community, sharing God's love with all those who come through the doors.

In response, in 2019 we launched an ambitious 4-phase building project which will (eventually) see us redevelop the full building. For now, however, we are focused on the first phase which will give us greater space for groups to meet, especially on Sundays; a new foyer area; a new kitchen and; so many opportunities to invite more people into the building.



We're excited about the impact this will have on our ability to serve and reach the community. The first phase is estimated to cost £3.2m, with the funds raised through a combination of church family giving, community fundraising, trusts and loans. Despite the challenges of the economy, giving is on course to start the build in May 2024.
